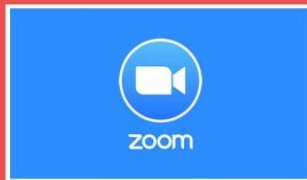

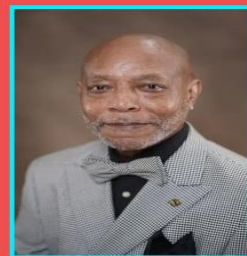

Sunday Morning Bible Study Lessons

April

Topic of the Month—The Measure of Faith

Unit II has four lessons drawn from Luke and Matthew to discuss the range of Christian faith:

1. Luke cites **four friends who went through various obstacles** to get their sick friend to Jesus for healing, and when Jesus saw their faith, He forgave and healed the paralytic.
2. Luke looks at **the faith of a centurion who amazed Jesus with his faith**, and Jesus acknowledged He had not found such faith in all Israel.
3. Luke identifies a **sinful woman Jesus forgave** because she had much faith.
4. Matthew identifies a **Canaanite woman recognized by Jesus for her great faith**.

April 7: Faith of the Persistent

Devotional Reading: John 4:4-18; Background Scripture Luke 5:17-16

A valid faith is a persistent faith.

April 14—Faith of a Centurion

Devotional Reading: Zechariah 8:18-23; Background Scripture: Luke 7:1-10

Faith is found in unexpected situations.

April 21—Faith of an Anointer

Devotional Reading: Romans 8:1-16; Background Scripture: Luke 7:36-39; 44-50

Saving faith focuses on what Jesus has done, not on what others think.

April 28—Faith of a Canaanite

Devotional Reading: Psalm 61; Background Scripture: Matthew 15:21-28

Click on Public Service. If you have ever worked or volunteered for a tax exempt or public service organization, please apply for service credit. They will send your information to the organization where you served to verify your information.

There are many other ways to qualify for student loan debt forgiveness. This week, I learned about several persons who were blessed to receive forgiveness for their student loans.

Dr. Freeman is requesting that Pastors, HBCUs, Alumni, Sororities, Fraternities, and Community agencies set up information assistance sessions or post links on their websites to help persons understand how to apply for Student Loan Forgiveness. Please help get our people out of this debt. As one church elder said he heard about student loan debt cancellation, but he had never met anyone who actually received it until yesterday.

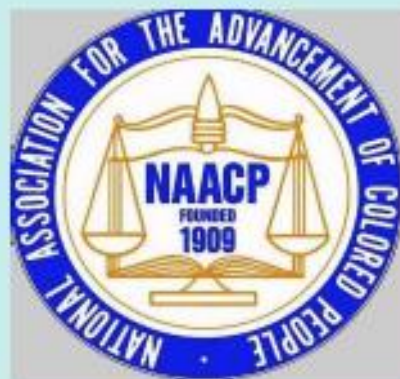
The New Hanover Branch of the NAACP 2024 Academic Scholarship Awards

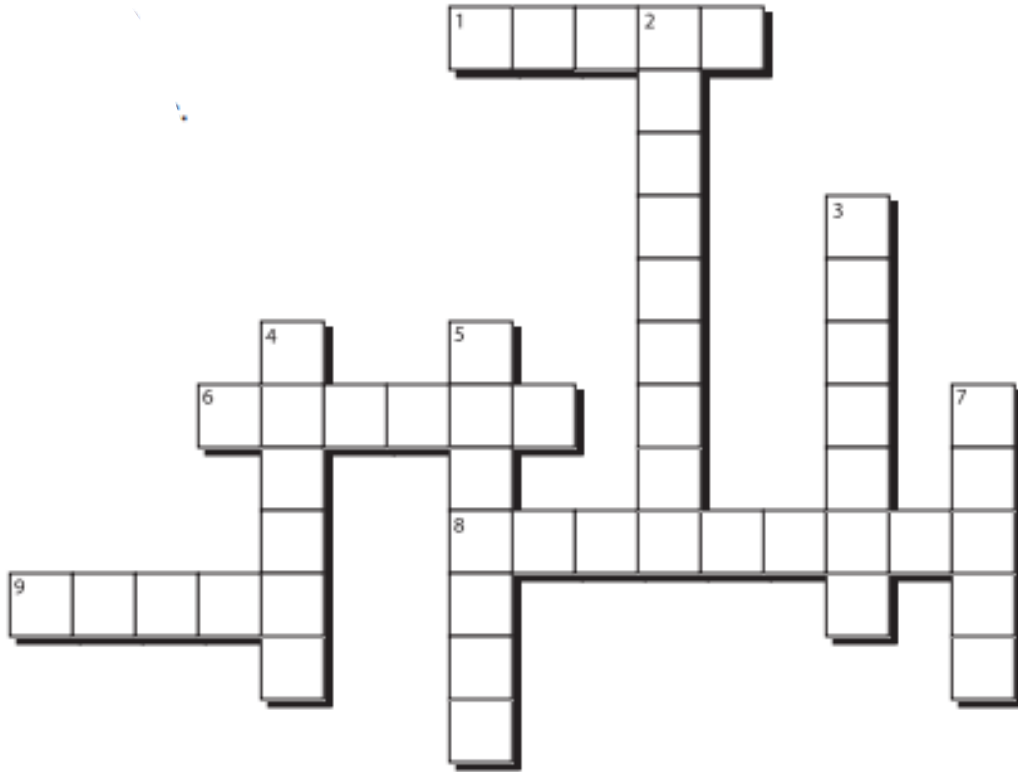

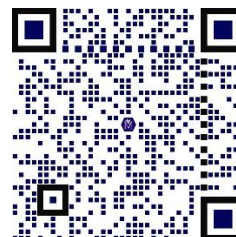
