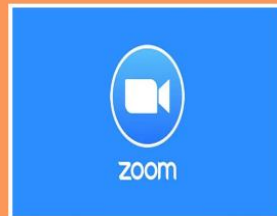

Sunday Morning Bible Study Lessons

Topic of the Month—Songs of the Old Testament

Unit II looks at various songs Israel used in worship and prayer. While we may not know the melody of their songs, we can get a sense of the mood embedded in the lyrics and what the people of Israel felt in the presence of God's power and goodness.

- Lesson 5 notes the deliverance of Israel from Pharaoh at the Red Sea and the song Miriam led in response.
- Lesson 6 considers Psalm 51, usually regarded as David's prayer of confession following his adultery with Bathsheba and the slaying of her husband Uriah in battle; children hear the background story of the death of Uriah.
- In Lesson 7, a plea for deliverance is considered through Psalm 22. At the same time, children study the rescue of Daniel's friends at a time when they might have prayed this psalm.
- Lesson 8 takes us to the first part of Isaiah 25, a song of praise for deliverance from oppression; children hear about Daniel's miraculous rescue from a den of lions.
- The final session of the unit (Lesson 9) looks at Psalm 62, a song of trust in God.

October 6—Prayers of Repentance and Confession

Devotional Reading: 2 Corinthians 7:5-11 **Background Scripture: Psalm 51:1-4, 10-12, 15-17**

It is challenging for people to acknowledge that they have hurt others. When David's sinful actions caused harm to others, he repented and found forgiveness in the Lord.

October 13—A Plea for Deliverance

Devotional Reading: Psalm 107:23-32 **Background Scripture: Psalm 22:1-11**

People may feel desperate or alone amid tragic circumstances. Calling on God for help gives a sense of release and bolsters hope for divine rescue.

October 20—Praise for Deliverance

Devotional Reading: Ephesians 1:3-14 **Background Scripture: Isaiah 25:1-10a**

People seek refuge during the stormy trials of life. God's promises and faithfulness can assure us that we will endure until the storm passes.

October 27—Trust in God Alone

Devotional Reading: Jeremiah 17:5-11 **Background Scripture: Psalm 62**

There are times when the fast pace of life keeps us in a frenzy. In stillness and quiet, the psalmist finds God's salvation, hope, refuge, and deliverance.

According to the National Breast Cancer Foundation, Inc., advancements in early detection methods and support continue to increase the chances of survival. When caught in its earlies, localized stages, the five-year relative survival rate of breast cancer is 99%.

Examine your breasts often physically and visually for signs and symptoms of abnormalities. By doing this you are becoming familiar with how your breasts look and feel normally. You will be able to find any new lumps or changes to your breasts. These changes should be reported to your doctor right away. Schedule your mammogram with your health care provider.

According to the American Cancer Society, there are some steps women and men can make to lower your risk for breast cancer.

- Stay physically active
- Avoid or limit alcohol



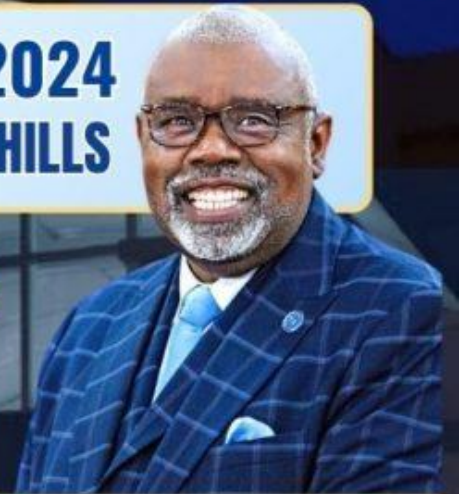

NEW HANOVER COUNTY

The Model of Good Governance

Application portal open for mental health and substance use disorder fellows program

NEW HANOVER COUNTY, NC – Students currently studying at in-state colleges or universities for careers helping others with mental health and substance use disorders can now apply for a fellows program with New Hanover County that will provide financial assistance for their education.

Now in its second year, this program aims to bring mental health and substance use disorder professionals to the county after graduation to serve those in need.

“Like so many communities across the nation, New Hanover County is still facing a mental health and substance use crisis, but we continue to make strides in helping our neighbors navigate these difficulties,” said Chief Diversity and Equity Officer Linda Thompson. “We had a remarkable response to the program last year and we are excited to work with our state schools to find students who can benefit from this financial support and help us address the diverse needs our community faces.”

Created using an allocation from the \$50 million Mental Health and Substance Use Disorder fund, ***the fellows program is designed to build staffing capacity for psychiatric nurse practitioners and mental health care providers in the county to address the need and fill critical gaps in services.***

For 2024-25 spring semester applicants, the portal is open through December 1. Awardees will be notified in mid-December if they have been selected to receive funding, which is renewable each semester with proof of satisfactory academic performance.

To be eligible for consideration, students must currently be enrolled and in good standing with a North Carolina accredited program at their respective educational institution. Following graduation and becoming licensed, fellows will commit to working with underserved populations in New Hanover County to receive tuition forgiveness. For psychiatric nurse practitioners, the minimum requirement for service is three years in the county, while mental health providers will be asked for two years of service in the county.

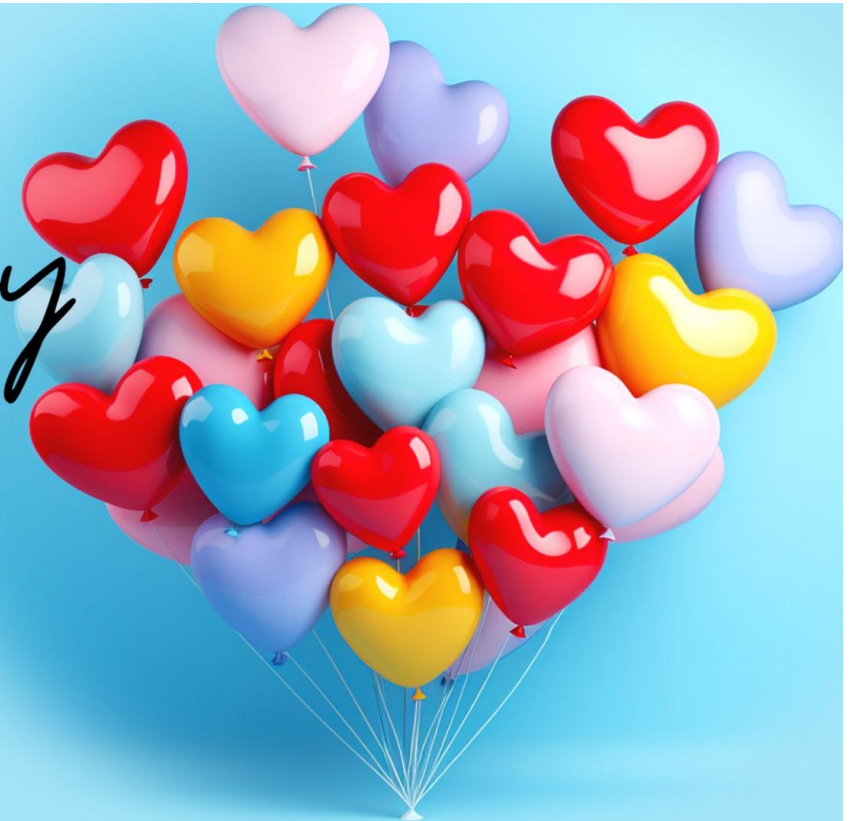

1. Examine your beliefs. Are you being led astray by any beliefs that contradict God's Word?
2. Examine your lifestyle. What are you pursuing? Is your lifestyle drawing you closer to God or keeping you from Him?
3. What steps might you take to correct what you have discovered?
4. Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to help you walk in obedience to this passage.

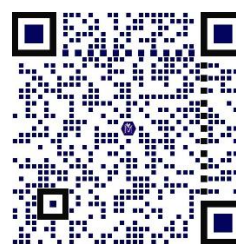

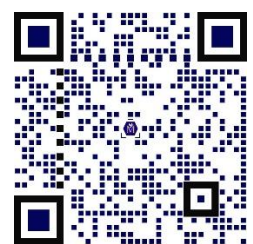
