Topic of the Month—Special Offerings and the Sanctuary: Unit III explores the unique relationship between the sanctuary and offerings or sacrifices. Lesson 10 from 1 Chronicles 21 relates David's refusal to accept a gift from Ornan for a sacrifice to the Lord because David would not "offer burnt offerings that cost me nothing." In lesson 11, we consider Solomon's Temple dedication and lavish sacrifices, as described in 2 Chronicles 7. Lesson 12 examines the laying of a new temple foundation by the people who had returned from exile to Jerusalem in Ezra 3. Lesson 13 concludes the quarter with covenant renewal and the people's pledge to observe the commands of the Torah and reject the abuse and neglect of the Temple.

May 4—David's Sacrifice

1 Chronicles 21:14-30

People find it difficult to accept the generosity of others when it comes to paying a debt. Is it right to accept a gift from one person in order to pay what is owed to another? David refuses Ornan's gift because his conscience would not permit him to offer to the Lord a sacrifice for which he did not pay.

May 11—Solomon Dedicates the Temple

2 Chronicles 7:1-7, 11

People honor special places with celebrations and gifts. What are appropriate ways to mark such spaces? Solomon dedicates the Temple and the altar for the worship of Yahweh.

May 18—Worship Is Restored After Exiles Return

Ezra 3:1-6, 10-13

When magnificent buildings are destroyed, it can be difficult to restore them to their original glory. How do we celebrate the new while we are still grieving the loss of the former? When the exiled Israelites returned and laid the foundation for a reconstruction of the Temple, the priests and Levites sang praises. Still, others wept because the second Temple was not as magnificent as the original.

May 25—A Covenant Renewal

Nehemiah 10:28-39

People appreciate efforts to restore time-honored practices and institutions. How can we match external efforts at restoration with internal ones? At the renewal of the Mosaic covenant, the people pledge to observe the commands of the Torah and reject the abuse and neglect of the Temple.







Darius earned his Culinary Arts degree from CFCC in 2016, and his family aims to provide financial assistance to students in this program.



NHC Fellows Program to offer financial assistance for students in mental health and substance use fields

WILMINGTON, N.C. (WECT) - Grad students at New Hanover County colleges can apply to the county's Fellows Program for financial assistance. The program offers forgivable financial assistance to anyone pursuing a career and will serve locally after graduating, according to the NHC Fellows Program.

The program has now received \$50 million in funds to increase more professionals in mental health and substance use disorder service providers.

"Over the last two years, we've connected with students who have a service-focused mentality and an incredible passion for this line of work—which is why we are so excited to begin working with our next cohort," said Chief Diversity and Equity Officer Linda Thompson. "We're grateful to our in-state institutions for their help in making this program possible, and we're excited to continue this partnership, which gets students the financial support they need for their educational journey while addressing a need for mental health providers in New Hanover County."

Anyone selected for the program who is enrolled in a psychiatric nurse practitioner program can receive up to \$4,500 per semester, with a maximum award of \$36,000. Students in the mental health provider program can receive \$3,500 per semester, with a maximum of \$14,000.

Applicants must be enrolled and in good standing with a North Carolina-accredited program to be eligible. Psychiatric nurse practitioners also must serve a minimum of three years in New Hanover County after graduating and obtaining a license, while mental health providers must serve two years.

Applications are open until June 30.


